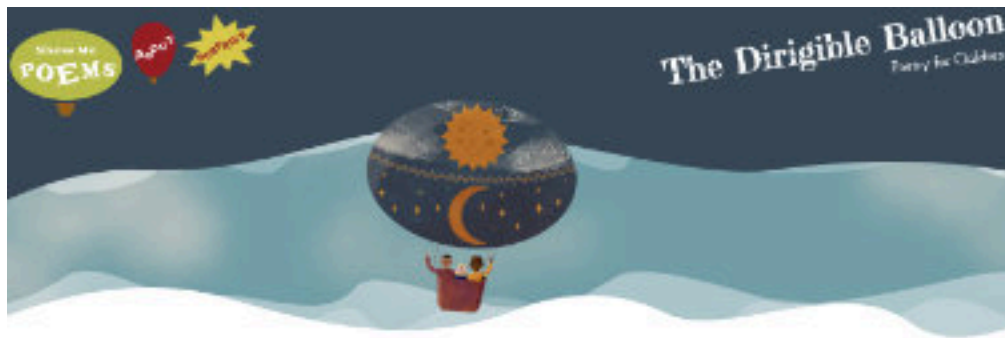


IF PARADISE... ANDY FAIRWEATHER LOW & THE LOW RIDERS AT SETTLE

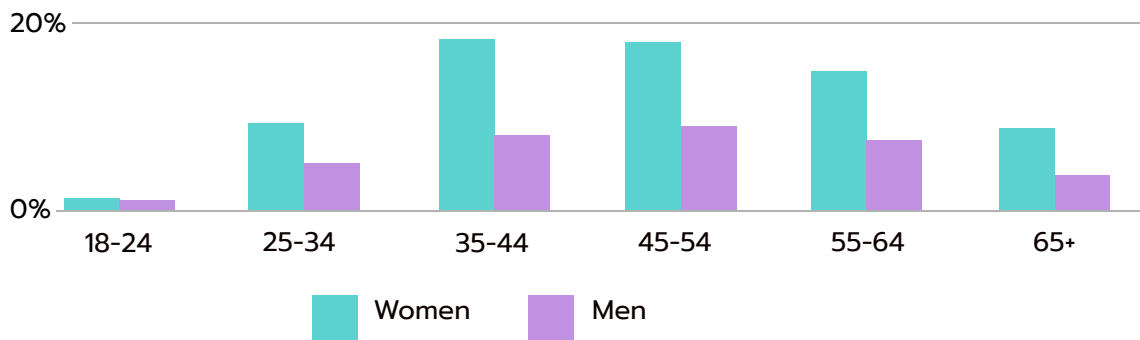

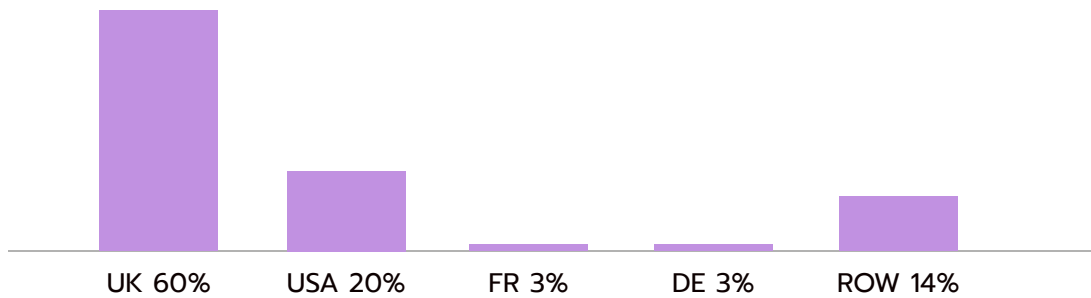

Age & Gender Profile

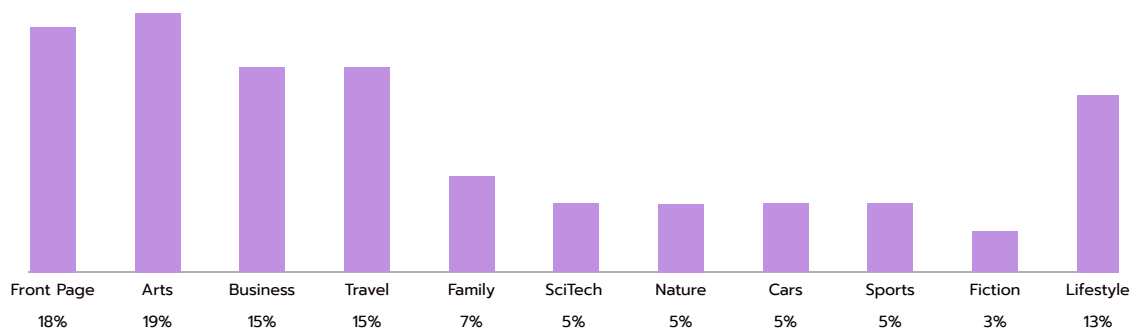


Data taken from the age profile of Facebook users who 'liked' any of our pages

Section Readership

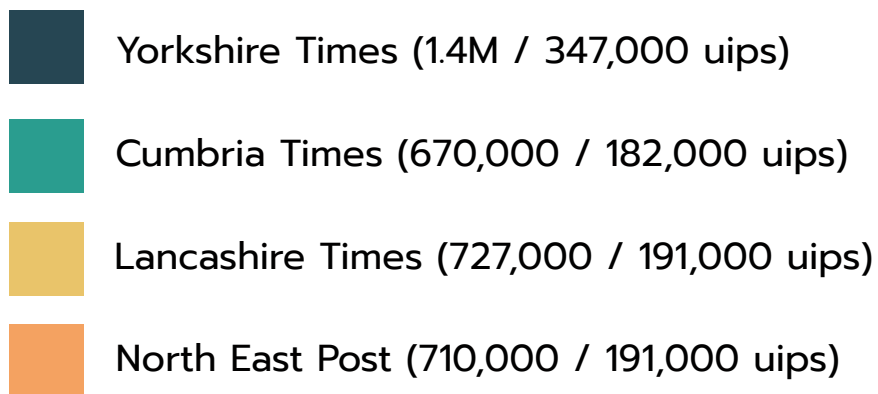
